## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The passing of Dr. John Lindsey Bradley of Tyler on 2 May 13, 2002, at the age of 85, has brought a great loss to all who 3 were privileged to know this esteemed physician and retired army 4 colonel; and

5 WHEREAS, A native of Moorhead, Mississippi, Dr. Bradley was 6 born on May 7, 1917, and earned his bachelor's degree from 7 Mississippi State University in 1939; he graduated from the 8 University of Tennessee Medical School in Memphis in 1942, and he 9 served his internship at Baptist Memorial Hospital in Memphis and 10 his residency at Georgetown University School of Medicine in 11 Washington, D.C.; and

12 WHEREAS, Dr. Bradley was a colonel in the United States Army 13 Medical Corps and served his country in World War II, the Korean 14 War, and the Vietnam War; during his outstanding 28-year military career, this dedicated physician served two tours of duty in 15 Heidelberg, Germany, and further distinguished himself as a 16 physician at Madigan General Hospital in Tacoma, Washington, as 17 chief of staff at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, and as commander 18 of the hospital center at Fort Ord in California; for his exemplary 19 service, Dr. Bradley was awarded the Legion of Merit with oak leaf 20 21 cluster; and

22 WHEREAS, From 1971 to 1985, Dr. Bradley practiced medicine 23 with the Texas Department of Health in El Paso, where he served as 24 the director of the West Texas Public Health Region; in addition, he
