WHEREAS, Behind the power running of junior tailback Chancy Campbell, the Rockets built an early first-half lead only to see Midland charge back in the second half; with 17 seconds remaining in the game and Midland leading 32-27, quarterback Dustin Quinney connected with wide receiver Andre Williams, who sprinted into the end zone to recapture the lead and effectively seal the improbable victory; and
