R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, The tragic loss of Stanley Wiley, who was killed in  
2 the line of duty on January 29, 2003, has left an immeasurable void  
3 in the lives of the family, friends, and colleagues of this beloved  
4 public servant; and

5           WHEREAS, Born and raised in Amarillo, Mr. Wiley graduated  
6 from Tascosa High School in 1982 and went on to study at Amarillo  
7 College; and

8           WHEREAS, He began his career with the Texas Department of  
9 Criminal Justice in June 1994 as a correctional officer at the Bill  
10 Clements Unit in Amarillo; he was later promoted to the position of  
11 industrial specialist, in which he supervised the prison's boot  
12 shop; and

13           WHEREAS, Residents of the Lone Star State are indebted to the  
14 men and women of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice who, by  
15 their dedication to the public welfare, have enabled us to enjoy the  
16 benefits of a peaceful and orderly society; these individuals risk  
17 their lives daily in order to ensure the safety of others; and

18           WHEREAS, Mr. Wiley's fine legacy will endure and continue to  
19 be a source of inspiration to those who follow in this difficult but  
20 essential profession; now, therefore, be it

21           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas  
22 Legislature hereby honor the life of Stanley Wiley and extend  
23 deepest sympathy to his family: to his father, Herman Wiley; to his  
24 sisters, Margaret Robertson and Catherine Nall; to his grandmother,

1 Laverne Powers; to his nieces, Melinda Robertson, Shannon  
2 Robertson, and Rachel Nall; to his nephews, David and Michael Nall;
