Carter were greatly saddened by her passing on November 30, 2002, at
the age of 76; and

WHEREAS, A native Texan, Mrs. Carter was born on July 5, 1926, and attended Furney Richardson Elementary and High School; she continued her education at Texas Southern University, Bishop College, and Pearson's Sewing School, where she specialized in clothing and textile design; and

9 WHEREAS, While Mrs. Carter cultivated a successful career as 10 a professional dressmaker and designer, she also distinguished 11 herself as a talented vocalist; in addition to singing with the Good 12 Street Baptist Church and Mass Choir, she was active with the 13 National Baptist Convention Choir and served as the director of 14 music for the citywide ministerial alliance revival; and

15 WHEREAS, The organizer and former director of the Good Street Baptist Church ministry for the mentally retarded, this esteemed 16 woman sought to raise awareness of the needs of people with mental 17 18 retardation in myriad ways through her volunteerism; she worked diligently to better meet those needs and to support 19 the 20 capabilities and potential of those she served, and her 21 achievements in this regard included the development of a 22 curriculum guide for people with mental retardation during her tenure as the national director of Christian education for the 23 National Baptist Convention; and 24

1 WHEREAS, Mrs. Carter was very involved in grassroots politics 2 and actively supported those candidates who shared her ideals and vision for the future; included among the numerous civic and 3 political organizations that benefited from Mrs. Carter's support 4 5 were the Dallas chapter of the NAACP, the Black Political Women's 6 Caucus, the African American Museum Guild, the Business and 7 Professional Women's Club, the YMCA, and the Top Ladies of 8 Distinction; and

9 WHEREAS, For her long-standing dedication to helping others, 10 Mrs. Carter was selected as the Outstanding Woman Serving Her 11 Community for 1999 by the National Council of Negro Women; she also 12 earned recognition from Eta Phi Beta Sorority, the NAACP, the YMCA, 13 and the Zeta Amicae Auxiliary; and

14 WHEREAS, In all aspects of her life, Mary Carter strove for 15 excellence and made the world a better place for her efforts; now, 16 therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas 18 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Mary Carter and extend 19 sincere sympathy to all who were privileged to share her 20 friendship; and, be it further

21 RESOLVED, That when the Texas House of Representatives 22 adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Mary Carter.
