6 Patricio counties before embarking on a career as a game warden with
7 the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department that would span nearly two

10 with commitment, integrity, and courage; his unwavering dedication
11 won the respect of his colleagues and served as an inspiration for
12 those just beginning their careers in the field; and

13 WHEREAS, In his free time, Mr. Madrigal filled his life with

15 coaching youngsters in the Delta Pony Baseball League and was an
16 avid dancer, particularly to the upbeat sounds of polka, ranchera,
17 guapango, and chotiz music; and

19 Catholic Church, Mr. Madrigal was a devoted family man and public
20 servant, and while he is greatly missed, his memory lives on in the
21 hearts and minds of the many people whose lives he touched; now,
