1 WHEREAS, In March 2003 *The Bastrop Advertiser* is celebrating
2 its 150th anniversary, and this is indeed an auspicious occasion
3 for the newspaper and the community it serves; and

4 WHEREAS, First published in 1853 by W. J. Cain, *The Bastrop*
5 *Advertiser* is one of the state's oldest weekly newspapers, and its
6 exceptional longevity is a result of the dedicated efforts of its
7 many employees, past and present, who worked to make it the county's
8 prime source of local news and opinion; and

9 WHEREAS, Over the course of its colorful history, *The Bastrop*
10 *Advertiser* has covered a diverse array of stories, publishing the
11 memoirs of Cayton Erhard, a Bastrop man who fought in the war with
12 Mexico, following the fortunes of local leaders who became
13 prominent political figures at the state level, and reporting on
14 the construction of Camp Swift; and

15 WHEREAS, This noteworthy paper is being honored with a
16 historical marker by the Texas Historical Commission, and the
17 unveiling of the marker is only part of the many festivities related
18 to the newspaper's 150th anniversary; and

19 WHEREAS, For a century and a half *The Bastrop Advertiser* has
20 provided its readers with a valuable source of news, information,
21 and opinion, and the publication is an enduring aspect of one of
22 Central Texas' oldest communities; now, therefore, be it
