RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, For more than 150 years, the residents of the city of 2 Mexia have made many important contributions to the culture and 3 economy of the Lone Star State, and Mexia Day at the State Capitol 4 provides a fitting occasion to honor these outstanding Texans; and

5 WHEREAS, This Limestone County community was named in honor 6 of the Mexia family, who in 1833 received a land grant for the local 7 area that encompassed 11 leagues; the town's history is 8 fascinating, and visitors from across the state travel there each 9 year to visit the Confederate Reunion Grounds and the Old Fort 10 Parker Historic Site; and

11 WHEREAS, In 1942, a camp for prisoners of war was established 12 in Mexia; the facility was converted in 1947 for use as the Mexia 13 State School, which has become the town's largest employer; and

14 WHEREAS, Mexia has been blessed with bountiful natural resources that have helped it to become a leading producer of 15 petroleum products, minerals, and agricultural products; in 1912, 16 the Mexia Oil and Gas Company located a large natural gas deposit, 17 18 and eight years later the community was transformed by the discovery of the Mexia oilfield, which had produced more than 100 19 million barrels of crude oil by the mid-1980s; today the city is a 20 21 prosperous industrial center, even serving as home to a Fortune 500 22 company; and

23 WHEREAS, With its rich heritage, abundant resources, and 24 dynamic citizenry, Mexia is a truly notable small city, and the
