## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Many proud citizens of Van Zandt County have come to 2 the State Capitol on March 19, 2003, to celebrate the significant 3 part they and their forebears have played in the development of the 4 Lone Star State; and

5 WHEREAS, Created by an Act of the Texas Legislature on March 6 20, 1847, this Northeast Texas county was named for Isaac Van Zandt, 7 a Republic of Texas lawyer, legislator, and diplomat; and

8 WHEREAS, Canton, the county seat, was laid out in 1850 and 9 incorporated in 1919; recently named a Main Street City, it is home 10 to the Van Zandt County Fair and First Monday Trade Days, one of the 11 country's best-known flea markets; a library of genealogy and local 12 history is also a popular attraction and preserves much of the 13 county's notable heritage; and

WHEREAS, The development of this fascinating area can be traced in a number of other communities as well; Edgewood, settled in the 1840s, boasts the Edgewood Heritage Park Museum, a facility dedicated to the preservation of rural cultural and architectural history; and

WHEREAS, Edom, established in 1856, is one of the oldest towns in the county, and its past is highlighted by 10 state historical markers, many of them researched by members of the Edom Historical Society; the residents of this small community also give hearty support to an active civic theater; and

WHEREAS, Fruit cultivation prompted the naming of Fruitvale,

1 where a nursery operated as early as the 1870s; several generations 2 in this century-old town have treasured the Randall Store, a local 3 institution since 1910; and

4 WHEREAS, Grand Saline, originally called Jordan's Saline, 5 the first Van Zandt County seat, takes its name from an immense dome 6 of pure salt lying beneath the city; more than a mile and a half wide 7 and 20,000 feet thick, the deposit is presently mined by Morton Salt 8 Company; the city celebrates salt with an annual Salt Festival; those exploring the town can tour the Salt Palace Museum, a unique 9 structure built with rock salt crystal, stop by the historical 10 marker that commemorates native son Wiley Post, the renowned 11 pioneer aviator, and visit the new Veterans Memorial Wall Park, 12 featuring a genuine U.S. Army tank; and 13

WHEREAS, Van, established in 1891, remained a quiet farming community until 1929, when the discovery of oil nearby transformed the village into a boomtown; the Van Area Oil and Historical Museum recaptures the excitement of that frenetic time and commemorates the discovery with an annual Oil Festival; and

WHEREAS, Wills Point, settled in 1873 and originally known as Iola, was renamed for William Wills, whose cabin served as a stopping place for those traveling between Shreveport and Dallas; the Wills cabin still stands, as does the Texas and Pacific Railroad depot, which houses the Historical Society Museum; Wills Point, which is officially the Bluebird Capital of Texas, hosts the annual Bluebird Festival; and

26 WHEREAS, Ben Wheeler, surrounded by natural springs and rich 27 farmland, was named for Van Zandt County's first mail carrier,

## 1 Benjamin R. Wheeler, in 1876; and

2 WHEREAS, Martins Mill got its name from Dan R. Martin's 3 gristmill and was established in 1880; the community survived 4 destruction by tornadoes and fires and today boasts a successful 5 school district; and

6 WHEREAS, Other major events in the county include the Texas 7 State Bluegrass Festival, the Edom Arts Fair, and the Van Zandt 8 County Relay for Life; for the outdoor enthusiast, the Neches and 9 Sabine rivers, Purtis Creek State Park, and Lake Tawakoni State 10 Park offer wonderful opportunities for fishing, boating, swimming, 11 and camping; and

WHEREAS, The home of nearly 48,000 people, Van Zandt County relies on tourism, oil, and agribusiness; the area is a major producer of hay, blueberries, sweet potatoes, and nursery crops, in addition to cattle, horses, hogs, and dairy products; and

16 WHEREAS, Present with us today in the Capitol are numerous 17 residents of Van Zandt County, including the Van Zandt County 18 Choir, city and county officials, and members of Vision 2003; also 19 in attendance are members of the Council of Van Zandt County 20 Communities, which sponsors the biennial visit to the state 21 legislature, an occasion for focusing on legislation affecting Van 22 Zandt County citizens; and

23 WHEREAS, The citizens of Van Zandt County take justifiable 24 pride in the hard work and ready cooperation that have made their 25 county an important part of this state, and it is a pleasure to join 26 them in honoring the county they are proud to call home; now, 27 therefore, be it
