RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The residents of Live Oak County have a fascinating 2 history that adds to the important cultural and economic 3 contributions they are making to the Lone Star State; and

WHEREAS, Settled perhaps more than 10,000 years ago by the first residents of Texas, the county was at various times inhabited by Indian tribes and later by Spanish and Mexican colonists as well as Irish immigrants; this diverse population faced grave challenges during the Texas Revolution, as expeditions launched by Mexico clashed with local residents and ownership of the land between the Nueces and the Rio Grande was hotly contested by Mexico and the Republic of Texas; and

WHEREAS, Live Oak County was officially formed on February 2, 1856, when the Texas Legislature created it from the counties of San Patricio and Nueces, naming it for the tree which was found over much of that region; and

WHEREAS, The county's population grew rapidly as its citizens focused their efforts on building successful cattle and sheep ranches; at the turn of the century, agriculture continued to dominate the region's economy, with cotton playing an important role in the lives of Live Oak residents, raising land prices, encouraging subdivision of land, and bringing new wealth and immigrants to the area; the resilience of county citizens was evident once again in the 1930s, when the discovery of oil and natural gas helped offset the combined effects of the Great

- 1 Depression and the declining cotton market; and
- WHEREAS, This South Texas county, inhabited by about 12,000
- 3 people, is situated on the brushy plains between San Antonio and
- 4 Corpus Christi and is traversed by the meandering Frio, Nueces, and
- 5 Atascosa rivers, as well as by many smaller tributaries;
- 6 additionally, it is home to such attractions as Lake Corpus Christi
- 7 and Choke Canyon State Park; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The residents of Live Oak County are justifiably
- 9 proud of their fine communities, including George West, the county
- 10 seat, Three Rivers, Dinero, Lagarto, Oakville, Pernitas Point, and
- 11 Whitsett, and it is a great pleasure to unite with our fellow Texans
- in saluting this notable Texas county; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas
- 14 Legislature hereby recognize March 10, 2003, as Live Oak County Day
- 15 at the State Capitol and extend to its citizens warmest best wishes
- 16 for a memorable and enjoyable visit.
