WHEREAS, Throughout his 11 years and nine months on the force, Motor Officer Morales demonstrated meritorious service, loyalty, personal bravery, and self-sacrifice consistent with the highest ideals of the law enforcement profession; and

WHEREAS, Motor Officer Morales was killed in the line of duty on December 11, 2001, and his untimely death was a tragic loss to his family, to his fellow peace officers, and to the entire community; and
