16 College, New Horizons Children's Home, and YMCA of Midland, and he
17 was also an active member of First Presbyterian Church of
18 Kerrville; and

20 possibilities; although his love and friendship will be missed by
21 all who knew him, his remarkable spirit will live on in the hearts
22 of those whose lives he touched during his time on this earth; now,
