

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, On March 13, 2003, the El Paso Commission for Women
2 is posthumously inducting Ann M. Enriquez into its Hall of Fame; and

3 WHEREAS, Established in 1985, the commission is composed of
4 El Paso citizens who are committed to the pursuit of equal rights
5 and responsibilities for all women; inductees to the organization's
6 Hall of Fame are recognized in one of five categories, including
7 arts, civic leadership, education, professional, and public
8 service; and

9 WHEREAS, Selected for the civic leadership category, Ms.
10 Enriquez used her position as the regional public affairs director
11 with Southern Union Gas to enhance the lives of her fellow Texans,
12 maintaining that her position was not about gaining recognition for
13 her company, but for contributing to the betterment of the
14 community; and

15 WHEREAS, Over the years, she had worked diligently in behalf
16 of numerous worthwhile civic programs, including the San Elizario
17 Independent School District, the R. E. Thomason Hospital Board, the
18 City-County Health and Environment District Board, Girl Scouts of
19 America, the YWCA, the El Paso Diabetes Association, and the
20 chamber of commerce; and

21 WHEREAS, The success of the State of Texas, the strength of
22 our communities, and the overall vitality of American society
23 depend on the dedication of people like Ms. Enriquez, who use their
24 considerable talents and resources to serve others, and it is a
