RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Citizens of Washington County are visiting the 2 Capitol on March 25, 2003, to celebrate their rich heritage and the 3 role their county has played in building the Lone Star State; and

WHEREAS, Members of Stephen F. Austin's Old 300 began settling in the area of Washington County in 1821; in 1836, at Washington-on-the-Brazos, delegates signed the Texas Declaration of Independence and drafted a constitution for the new republic; later, from 1842 to 1845, this community served as the capital of the republic; and

10 WHEREAS, Washington County was created in 1836 and organized 11 the following year; situated on the Blackland Prairies, the region 12 attracted substantial immigration and developed quickly; included 13 in the flow of newcomers were Germans, Czechs, and Poles, who began 14 arriving in the mid-19th century; and

WHEREAS, The foundation of several colleges in the 1840s and 16 1850s, among them Baylor University and a precursor to Southwestern 17 University, testified to the dynamic nature of Washington County; 18 today Blinn College, established in 1883 in Brenham, the county 19 seat, carries on the county's early tradition of higher learning; 20 and

21 WHEREAS, An important part of this rich heritage of education 22 is Brenham Independent School District (BISD), which ably serves 23 the educational needs of more than 4,700 students in Washington 24 County; the first public chartered school district in Texas, BISD

1 is the proud home to Brenham High School, whose varsity football 2 team won the 2002 district title and reached the final game of the 3 4A high school playoffs; and

WHEREAS, The region's natural beauty and its prominent role 4 5 in early Texas history have made Washington County a popular destination for visitors who can wander its scenic country roads, 6 enjoy the recreation afforded by Somerville Lake, and step into the 7 8 past at the Brenham, Burton, Chappell Hill, and Texas Baptist museums; the 9 Star of the Republic Museum, in 10 Washington-on-the-Brazos State Historical Park, tells the story of 11 the Texas Republic; and

12 WHEREAS, Other popular attractions include the Blue Bell 13 Creameries, an eight-acre antique rose garden, and a miniature 14 horse farm; among the many festivals are the venerable Washington 15 County Fair, Burton's Cotton Gin Festival, Chappell Hill's 16 Bluebonnet and Scarecrow festivals, and Brenham's Maifest; and

WHEREAS, The industrious residents of this vital Texas county are preserving the best of their past and looking forward to the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead, and it is indeed a pleasure to honor them at this time; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas Legislature hereby recognize March 25, 2003, as Washington County Day at the State Capitol and extend to the delegation present on this day sincere best wishes for an enjoyable and memorable visit.
