R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, On April 30, 2003, Sergeant Kenneth Joseph Crissman  
2 is retiring from the Missouri City Police Department, bringing to a  
3 close an outstanding tenure in law enforcement that has spanned  
4 more than 30 years; and

5           WHEREAS, Initially a reserve police officer, this dedicated  
6 public servant became a full-time police officer in 1974; two years  
7 later, he was promoted to his current rank of sergeant and, over the  
8 years, has also held the positions of acting lieutenant and  
9 training sergeant; and

10           WHEREAS, A master peace officer, Sergeant Crissman is a  
11 certified police instructor who has taught at the Gus George Law  
12 Enforcement Academy, the University of Houston, and Wharton County  
13 Junior College; he has also served as a firearms instructor for his  
14 department; and

15           WHEREAS, In addition to serving as a member of the police  
16 force, Sergeant Crissman has made contributions to the public  
17 welfare through his service in the United States Army and as a  
18 volunteer firefighter with the local fire department; and

19           WHEREAS, Throughout the course of his tenure with the  
20 Missouri City Police Department, he has set standards of  
21 professionalism to which all in the field of law enforcement can  
22 aspire, and it is indeed appropriate that he be honored at this  
23 time; now, therefore, be it

24           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas

1 Legislature hereby commend Sergeant Kenneth Joseph Crissman on his  
2 exemplary career with the Missouri City Police Department and  
3 extend to him sincere best wishes for a happy and rewarding  
4 retirement; and, be it further
