1 WHEREAS, For nearly 30 years, the Houston Heights Tower has
2 been dedicated to preserving personal independence and providing
3 fellowship opportunities for area senior citizens; and

4 WHEREAS, A vision born of the Reverend Jim Smith, the
5 facility was a labor of love, built through the combined efforts of
6 St. Andrews Episcopal Church, Heights Presbyterian Church, Heights
7 Christian Church, and All Saints Catholic Church; Heights Tower
8 filled a void in the central Houston area, providing a home for
9 self-reliant seniors who no longer wished to be burdened with the
10 upkeep of a house and yard; and

11 WHEREAS, The groundbreaking ceremony was held on July 13,
12 1973; built within proximity of a hospital, grocery store,
13 pharmacy, beauty salon, and park, Houston Heights Tower is well
14 suited to meeting the needs of its residents; and

15 WHEREAS, This outstanding residential facility has been a
16 haven for area senior citizens, offering the promise of enjoyable
17 recreational activities, affordable housing, and the companionship
18 of good friends who share the desire to lead active lives; Houston
19 Heights Tower has blessed the lives of many by preserving the
20 dignity of its residents, serving as an island of support,
21 encouragement, and security to revered members of society who have
22 earned the privilege that should accompany a long and meaningful
23 life; now, therefore, be it
