

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, Reaching the pinnacle of success in his sport,  
2 Trevor Brazile of Anson has been named the 2002 All-Around Cowboy of  
3 the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA); and

4           WHEREAS, Rodeo is a challenging and often perilous sport that  
5 requires both extraordinary physical skill and outstanding  
6 concentration to successfully compete at the highest level, and Mr.  
7 Brazile has shown himself to be a world champion in this regard; and

8           WHEREAS, This exceptional athlete has earned numerous  
9 accolades throughout his rodeo career on local, state, and national  
10 levels; just two years after joining the PRCA, Mr. Brazile showed  
11 his mettle by becoming the 1998 Timed Event Champion of the World,  
12 which has proven to be the first of a growing number of  
13 championships for him; and

14           WHEREAS, In 2002, already established as the reserve world  
15 steer roping champion, Mr. Brazile came to the Wrangler National  
16 Finals Rodeo in Las Vegas as one of only 12 cowboys to qualify for  
17 three events: calf roping, team roping, and steer roping; in the  
18 10th and final round, in front of a sold-out crowd of 17,681 at the  
19 Thomas & Mack Center, his determination and hard work were justly  
20 rewarded when he claimed the coveted world title; and

21           WHEREAS, The sport of rodeo occupies a prominent place in our  
22 state's rich athletic heritage, and Mr. Brazile has added another  
23 memorable chapter to the enduring legacy of athletic excellence in  
24 the Lone Star State; now, therefore, be it
