## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Residents of Sour Lake have made many important contributions to the economy and culture of the Lone Star State, and this year, as the city commemorates its history with the Star Centennial Celebration, we are reminded to pay special tribute to these proud and hardworking Texans; and

WHEREAS, This Hardin County community, originally called Sour Lake Springs, was settled in the mid-1830s; the town soon became an elite spa destination for affluent travelers in search of health, relaxation, and entertainment; those unable to make the trip in person could still enjoy the benefits of the legendary springs, as the entrepreneurs of Sour Lake packaged, marketed, and sold drinking water to residents of Galveston and Houston; and

WHEREAS, With the dawn of the new century came dramatic changes for this spa community; the Texas Company, now known the world over as Texaco, bought large tracts of land for petroleum exploration, and on January 8, 1903, oil was discovered at its Fee No. 3 site, assuring the corporation's future as a leader in energy exploration and production; Sour Lake, the company's birthplace, became famous as the home of "Shoestring Row," a strip of oil derricks that were so densely packed that an oilman could walk from one platform to another for a distance of nearly half a mile; and

WHEREAS, In recent years, Sour Lake has returned to its roots as a small, quiet country town, and its 1,700 residents take great pride in their community's past while looking forward each day to

its bright future; last September, the Sour Lake Heritage Festival 1 2 marked the opening of the town's Oil Centennial Program, which 3 culminated on January 8, 2003, with a gala celebration that 4 featured historical reenactments, food and refreshments, art and essay award presentations, and the sealing of a time capsule to be 5 6 opened in the year 2103; since its inception, this remarkable town has exemplified the determination, enthusiasm, and perseverance 7 8 that are the true hallmarks of the Lone Star spirit, and its contributions to Hardin County and the State of Texas are worthy of 9 commendation and praise; now, therefore, be it 10
