12 Texas as an employee of the Texas House of Representatives in 1972
13 and continued his service with the Texas Alcoholic Beverage
14 Commission (TABC); this notable gentleman committed 26 years to
15 TABC, serving with distinction as director of human resources,
16 director of financing and budgeting, and legislative liaison and
17 retiring as assistant administrator; and

18 WHEREAS, Active in many business organizations, he has been
19 president of the National Conference of State Liquor Administrators
20 and served as chairman of the Joint Committee of the States, a group
21 responsible for policy recommendations for national alcohol
22 regulatory agencies; duly recognized for his efforts, he was also
23 named to the Governor's Task Force on Illegal Gambling; and

24 WHEREAS, He has been supported in all of his endeavors by his

1 wife of more than 25 years, Diana; the couple are active members of
2 their church, where Mr. Yarbrough is a part-time worship leader and
3 sings with the Westover Hills Singers; he also volunteers with
4 Habitat for Humanity and has served on the board of Camp of the
5 Hills; and

6 WHEREAS, On September 30, 2002, Mr. Yarbrough concluded his
7 exemplary career in state service, leaving a legacy of hard work,
8 commitment, and integrity, and he is truly deserving of special
9 recognition; now, therefore, be it

12 dedicated service to the State of Texas and extend to him sincere
