RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, June 2003 is Menopause Awareness Month, providing an 2 opportunity for Texans to learn more about this natural condition 3 that normally affects women between the ages of 40 and 55; and

WHEREAS, Bringing a change of life that can be accompanied by symptoms that range from mild to severe and that include such problems as mood swings and hot flashes, menopause is a transition period during which a woman's body decreases the production of estrogen and progesterone; and

9 WHEREAS, The long-term health risks associated with 10 menopause include osteoporosis, heart disease, and various other 11 health issues; more than 50 percent of women over the age of 50 will 12 suffer an osteoporotic fracture or die from cardiovascular disease; 13 and

14 WHEREAS, Many women do not have access to health care 15 professionals who can help them evaluate the extensive and often 16 complex literature about menopause and their health or explain the 17 variety of treatment options available to them; and

18 WHEREAS, This special month is an important public awareness 19 campaign through which women in our state can learn to deal with the 20 impact of menopause on their lives and assess the treatment options 21 for menopausal symptoms; now, therefore, be it

22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas 23 Legislature hereby recognize June 2003 as Menopause Awareness Month 24 in Texas and encourage all Texans to support efforts to provide

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1 women with the vital information and assistance needed to live 2 healthy lives during menopause.
