6 restaurants; in 1964, she became a waitress for the Country Tavern,
7 and, after diligently saving her money, Ms. Mason purchased the
8 Country Tavern in 1974; and

9 WHEREAS, For more than a quarter of a century, Ms. Mason
10 delighted countless Kilgore residents and visitors with her superb
11 country fare; rated one of Texas' best barbecue restaurants by
12 *Texas Monthly* and *Texas Highways*, the Country Tavern has attracted
13 people from far and wide, including George Bush, Miss Texas, and
14 Larry Hagman; and

15 WHEREAS, In addition to being a successful businesswoman, Ms.
16 Mason was a devoted wife and caring mother, grandmother, and
17 great-grandmother, as well as a valued member of the Kilgore
18 community; and

19 WHEREAS, Lois Mason's legacy can be found not only in the
20 successful Country Tavern, but also in her lasting, positive
21 impression on her family and many friends, and her spirit will
22 forever shine brightly within their hearts; now, therefore, be it

23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas
24 Legislature hereby pay special tribute to the life of Lois Mason and

1 extend sincere sympathy to the members of her family: to her
