1 WHEREAS, North Texas residents lost an esteemed neighbor,  
2 friend, and public servant with the untimely passing of Detective  
3 William James "Bill" Carollo on April 5, 2003, at the age of 46; and

4 WHEREAS, A former United States marine, Detective Carollo  
5 worked on a suburban Chicago police force before joining the Dallas  
6 Police Department (DPD) where, with the exception of a year and a  
7 half during which he worked as a special agent with the FBI, he  
8 spent the duration of his career; he was an 18-year veteran of DPD  
9 and was most recently assigned to the Homicide Unit in the  
10 department's Crimes Against Persons Division; and

11 WHEREAS, He was the vice president of the Dallas Police  
12 Association and was instrumental in establishing Assist the  
13 Officer, an organization that helps families of officers who are  
14 injured or killed; and

15 WHEREAS, A passionate defender of life and property,  
16 Detective Carollo lost his life in a car accident while he was  
17 driving to his Euless home; his passing was a tragic loss to his  
18 family, to his fellow officers, and to the entire community; and

19 WHEREAS, Detective Carollo will be greatly missed, but his  
20 legacy of heroic dedication to his duty and commitment to others  
21 will continue to be a source of inspiration for the countless people  
22 whose lives he touched; now, therefore, be it

23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas  
24 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of William James "Bill"

1 Carollo and extend sincere sympathy to the members of his family:  
2 to his daughter, Nicole Marie Carollo; to his former wife, Ramona  
3 Kay Carollo; to his sister, Kathleen M. Hanson; to his brothers,  
4 Robert J. Carollo, Michael J. Carollo, and George Carollo; to his  
5 stepson, Nathan Bittle; and to his other relatives and many
