RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Words cannot adequately express the sorrow felt at 2 the loss of Sergeant Donald R. Walters, of Kansas City, Missouri, 3 who died in the Iraqi campaign on March 23, 2003, at the age of 33; 4 and

5 WHEREAS, Sergeant Walters was one of nine soldiers from the 6 army's 507th Maintenance Company who lost their lives in an ambush 7 in southern Iraq; for his valiant service in Operation Iraqi 8 Freedom, Sergeant Walters was posthumously awarded a Bronze Star 9 and a Purple Heart; and

10 WHEREAS, This courageous soldier saw combat in the first 11 Persian Gulf War and later served in the army reserves; he 12 reenlisted in the summer of 2002, motivated by a desire to serve his 13 country and to provide a better life for his wife and three 14 daughters; before his deployment overseas on February 17, 2003, he 15 was stationed at Fort Bliss, near El Paso; and

16 WHEREAS, A member of an air force family as a child, Sergeant 17 Walters grew up in Salem, Oregon, and Colorado Springs, Colorado; 18 during the interval following his first period of active military 19 service, he worked as a corrections officer and also at the Kansas 20 City airport; and

21 WHEREAS, Deeply devoted to his family, Sergeant Walters was 22 widely regarded with fond affection for his cheerful and 23 open-hearted nature; in addition to pursuing an army career, he 24 also aspired to write children's books; and

Walters and extend sincere sympathy to the members of his 13 family: to his wife, Stacie Walters; to his daughters, Monica, 14 Danielle, and Amber Rose Walters; and to the other relatives and 15 many friends of this beloved American soldier; and, be it further
