- 1 WHEREAS, In 1966, Texas Western College, now The University
- of Texas at El Paso, faced the No. 1 ranked University of Kentucky
- 3 men's basketball team in the National Collegiate Athletic
- 4 Association (NCAA) national championship game; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The University of Texas at El Paso Miners made NCAA
- 6 history as the first college team to start an all African American
- 7 lineup, starting five in the national championship game against the
- 8 University of Kentucky Wildcats; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The University of Texas at El Paso, which was
- 10 overlooked in preseason ratings, became the collegiate basketball
- 11 champion for the first time by defeating longtime powerhouse
- 12 Kentucky; and
- WHEREAS, The Texas Western players' rebounding strength and
- 14 fine shooting kept them ahead from after 9 minutes, 40 seconds, of
- the first half until the end of the game, when the Miners defeated
- 16 the Wildcats 72-65; and
- WHEREAS, This win made Coach Don Haskins, a.k.a. "The Bear,"
- 18 a coaching legend and changed the face of college basketball
- 19 forever, ultimately leading to his induction into the Basketball
- 20 Hall of Fame in 1997; and
- 21 WHEREAS, To this day, The University of Texas at El Paso
- 22 remains the only school in the Lone Star State to win a Division I
- 23 national championship in men's basketball; and
- WHEREAS, The 37th anniversary of this landmark event provides

- 1 an ideal opportunity to honor the exceptional achievements of these
- 2 remarkable student-athletes and their coach; now, therefore, be it
