1 WHEREAS, The Texas House of Representatives is pleased to
2 recognize the Friendswood High School Academic Decathlon team for
3 its 11th consecutive victory in the state championship competition
4 in March 2003; and

5 WHEREAS, The Academic Decathlon program provides high school
6 students an opportunity to experience the challenges of rigorous
7 academic competition through participation in team activities; the
8 schools are classified as either large, medium, or small, and each
9 nine-member team consists of three A students, three B students,
10 and three C students; and

12 medium school category and won over \$20,800 in scholarship money
13 while receiving 47 medals in the competition that included tests on
14 academic strengths and communication ability; 11 straight wins at
15 the state level is quite an accomplishment and a reflection of the

21 excelled in their knowledge of art, economics, language and
22 literature, mathematics, music, social science, and oceanography;

2 parents, and their outstanding achievements are indeed worthy of
3 special legislative recognition; now, therefore, be it
