R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, In times of great peril throughout the history of  
2 our nation, men and women of the United States military have gone  
3 bravely into battle; and

4           WHEREAS, U.S. Army Chief Warrant Officer Scott Jamar embarked  
5 from Fort Stewart, Georgia, in support of our nation's campaign to  
6 liberate Iraqi citizens from repression; he was killed in action  
7 when the Black Hawk helicopter he was aboard crashed in central  
8 Iraq; and

9           WHEREAS, The loving father of two sons, this brave soldier  
10 graduated from Sweetwater High School in 1989 before joining the  
11 military to pursue his dream of becoming a helicopter pilot; he died  
12 April 2, 2003, for the hopes and dreams of men and women in his  
13 country and so that men and women in a faraway country could also  
14 hope and dream; and

15           WHEREAS, Unflinching bravery and a resolute commitment to  
16 fulfill his oath to serve, regardless of the personal consequences,  
17 were demonstrated by this valorous American; the State of Texas and  
18 the nation now mourn the loss of Scott Jamar, a true hero; now,  
19 therefore, be it

20           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas  
21 Legislature hereby honor the life of Scott Jamar and extend to his  
22 family deepest sympathy: to his sons, Brennan and Kyle; to his  
23 parents, Wayne and Jennifer Jamar; to his sister, Elizabeth Jamar;  
24 to his brother, Paul; to his grandparents, Odean Jamar and Neva and
