WHEREAS, Sergeant Vollbrecht embarked on his notable 29-year career in the United States Air Force in 1971; he completed tours of duty in Alaska, Hawaii, Michigan, and Texas, as well as in Germany, Cuba, the Marshall Islands, and the Netherlands, earning the respect and admiration of officers and enlisted corps alike; and
