3 Smith during a service at Golden Gate Missionary Baptist Church in

5 WHEREAS, A native Texan, Reverend Smith attended Saint
6 Phillips Junior College, Bishop College, and Southwestern
7 Theological Seminary; he preached his first sermon on January 6,
8 1946, at New Light Baptist Church in San Antonio, and he has won the
9 respect and admiration of congregants and colleagues alike for his
10 wisdom, unwavering faith, and dynamic leadership; and

11 WHEREAS, This distinguished gentleman ministered to the
12 members of Golden Gate Missionary Baptist Church for some 45 years,
13 before retiring in 1997; he has also held leadership positions in
14 religious organizations at the local, state, and national levels,
15 including the North Texas District Association, the Missionary
16 Baptist General Convention of Texas, the National Baptist Congress
17 of Christian Workers, the National Baptist Convention of America,
18 Inc., and the National Council of Churches; and

21 Christian living legend," and he is most deserving of this special
