2 Program, created in January 2002, has achieved considerable success  
3 in its short history and shows great promise for the future; and

4           WHEREAS, Under the direction of the Neuhaus Education Center  
5 and funded by The Houston Annenberg Challenge and the Cullen  
6 Foundation, the program is designed to assist struggling readers,  
7 particularly in first and second grades, through a special  
8 curriculum and by involving their parents in the learning process;

10          WHEREAS, Coordinator Dianne Wells, assisted by two of the  
11 school's teachers, is working with students and their parents to  
12 build the children's reading skills in a family-friendly  
13 environment; and

16 the Whittier Elementary School Family Literacy Program is designed  
17 to help students to master this vital skill, and all those  
18 associated with the initiative are indeed worthy of special
