

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, As Hipolito H. Garza celebrates his 80th birthday on  
2 November 8, 2003, he joins the ranks of octogenarians living in  
3 Texas whose lifetime of work and experience greatly benefits their  
4 state; and

5           WHEREAS, A native of Kingsville, he joined the 9th Army Air  
6 Force at the age of 18 and served his country with distinction as a  
7 member of the 596th Bomb Squadron, 397th Bomb Group; he  
8 participated in 28 missions over France, Belgium, Holland,  
9 Luxembourg, and Germany, during which he was shot down on three  
10 occasions, sustaining a lifelong back injury; he was honorably  
11 discharged in 1945 with the rank of staff sergeant; and

12           WHEREAS, Mr. Garza's meritorious military service was  
13 recognized with the European-African Middle East Theater Ribbon  
14 with 2 Bronze Stars, an Overseas Bar, an Aerial Gunner Badge, and  
15 the Air Medal with 3 Oak Leaf Clusters; and

16           WHEREAS, Returning home after the war, he attended Texas A&I  
17 University and established a career with the Corpus Christi Army  
18 Depot as an aircraft sheet metal worker whose responsibilities  
19 included repairing Huey helicopters for use in Vietnam; he retired  
20 after a notable career that spanned more than 33 years; and

21           WHEREAS, In 1980, Mr. Garza again enrolled at Texas A&I  
22 University to complete requirements for a bachelor's degree in  
23 secondary education; over the course of four years of teaching at  
24 Robstown High School, he sponsored the Vocational Industrial Clubs

1 of America (VICA) and proudly watched his students serve as  
2 president of the state VICA organization for two consecutive years;  
3 and

4 WHEREAS, Mr. Garza has always been ready to lend a helping  
5 hand with his children's school carnivals and other activities,  
6 with the work of the Knights of Columbus, and with sponsorship of a  
7 Hispanic youth club, the Kingsmen, comprised of teenagers attending  
8 H. M. King High School in Kingsville; and

9 WHEREAS, As he marks eight decades, Mr. Garza can take great  
10 pride in his achievements as a successful citizen, veteran,  
11 husband, father of six, retired civil service employee, educator,  
12 youth activities sponsor, and community servant; now, therefore, be  
13 it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas  
15 Legislature hereby honor Hipolito H. Garza on the eve of the joyous  
16 occasion of his 80th birthday and extend to him warmest best wishes  
17 for continued happiness; and, be it further

18 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be  
19 prepared for Mr. Garza as an expression of high regard by the Texas  
20 House of Representatives.
