2 two aunts, all of whom taught school for 50 years, LaRue Dorsey is
3 concluding more than half a century in education with her
4 retirement from the Waco Independent School District in 2003; and

6 Mary Allen College in 1952 and her master of education degree from
7 Texas Southern University in 1955; she began her career by teaching
8 fifth grade in Stamford, and since 1960 she has taught fifth and
9 sixth grades and pre-kindergarten in the Waco ISD; and

10 WHEREAS, Encouraging her students to excel by providing a
11 supportive and challenging classroom environment, Ms. Dorsey has
12 worked to instill a lifelong love of learning in each child that she
13 has taught; she is a motivator who helps the young boys and girls
14 develop self-confidence and the awareness that they are capable of
15 great achievements; and

17 recognitions, but undoubtedly her greatest reward comes from
18 knowing that she has positively affected the lives of hundreds of
19 young Texans and that her influence can be felt through many
20 generations; now, therefore, be it
