RESOLUTION

1	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of
2	Texas, 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, That House Rule 13,
3	Section 9(a), be suspended in part as provided by House Rule 13,
4	Section 9(f), to enable the conference committee appointed to
5	resolve the differences on Senate Bill 473, relating to assisting
6	consumers to prevent identity theft; providing penalties, to
7	consider and take action on the following matter:
8	(1) House Rule 13, Sections 9(a)(3) and (4), are suspended
9	to permit the committee to add new text to Section 35.58, Business &
10	Commerce Code, as added by the bill, so that the section reads as
11	follows:
12	Sec. 35.58. CONFIDENTIALITY OF SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER. (a)
13	A person, other than government or a governmental subdivision or
14	agency, may not:
15	(1) intentionally communicate or otherwise make
16	available to the general public an individual's social security
17	number;
18	(2) display an individual's social security number on
19	a card or other device required to access a product or service
20	provided by the person;
21	(3) require an individual to transmit the individual's
22	social security number over the Internet unless the connection with
23	the Internet is secure or the number is encrypted;

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H.R. No. 1706 (4) require an individual's social security number for 1 2 access to an Internet website, unless a password or unique personal identification number or other authentication device is also 3 4 required for access; or (5) print an individual's social security number on 5 6 any materials, except as provided by Subsection (f), that are sent 7 by mail, unless state or federal law requires that the individual's 8 social security number be included in the materials. 9 (b) A person that is using an individual's social security number before January 1, 2005, in a manner prohibited by Subsection 10 11 (a) may continue that use if: 12 (1) the use is continuous; and (2) the person provides annual disclosure to the 13 individual, beginning January 1, 2006, stating that on written 14 15 request from the individual the person will cease to use the 16 individual's social security number in a manner prohibited by 17 Subsection (a). (c) A person, other than government or a governmental 18 subdivision or agency, may not deny services to an individual 19 20 because the individual makes a written request under Subsection 21 (b). 22 (d) If a person receives a written request from an individual directing the person to stop using the individual's 23 24 social security number in a manner prohibited by Subsection (a), 25 the person shall comply with the request not later than the 30th day 26 after the date the request is received. The person may not impose a 27 fee or charge for complying with the request.

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1	(e) This section does not apply to:
2	(1) the collection, use, or release of a social
3	security number that is required by state or federal law, including
4	Chapter 552, Government Code;
5	(2) the use of a social security number for internal
6	verification or administrative purposes;
7	(3) documents that are recorded or required to be open
8	to the public under Chapter 552, Government Code;
9	(4) court records; or
10	(5) an institution of higher education if the use of a
11	social security number by the institution is regulated by Chapter
12	51, Education Code, or another provision of the Education Code.
13	(f) Subsection (a)(5) does not apply to an application or
14	form sent by mail, including a document sent:
15	(1) as part of an application or enrollment process;
16	(2) to establish, amend, or terminate an account,
17	contract, or policy; or
18	(3) to confirm the accuracy of a social security
19	number.
20	Explanation: The addition is necessary to establish a date
21	on which disclosure to an individual concerning use of the
22	individual's social security number must begin, to allow
23	institutions of higher education to use an individual's social
24	security number to comply with provisions of the Education Code,
25	and to provide that a person who receives a request to stop using an
26	individual's social security number must honor that request free of
27	charge by a certain time.

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1 (2) House Rule 13, Sections 9(a)(3) and (4), are suspended 2 to permit the committee to add a new Subsection (f) to SECTION 10 of 3 the bill, to read as follows:

4 (f) An institution of higher education that is not subject
5 to the exemption prescribed by Section 35.58(e)(5), Business &
6 Commerce Code, as added by this Act, shall begin acting in
7 compliance with Section 35.58, Business & Commerce Code, as added
8 by this Act, on or before September 1, 2007.

9 Explanation: The added text is necessary to explain when 10 institutions of higher education must comply with Section 35.58, 11 Business & Commerce Code.
