

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Named for attorney William H. Lyford of the Chicago
2 and Eastern Illinois Railroad, the city of Lyford is situated in
3 Willacy County, the site of three Spanish land grants; and

4 WHEREAS, Once part of the San Juan de Carricitos land grant,
5 Lyford was platted in 1907; its early buildings included Pioneer
6 Hall, which served as a school, place of worship, and facility for
7 general gatherings, a post office, and the Lyford Hotel; by the turn
8 of the 21st century, the town's population had reached
9 approximately 2,000; and

10 WHEREAS, Lyford possesses a long and rich heritage, and the
11 contributions its residents have made to the Lone Star State are
12 truly commendable; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas
14 Legislature hereby honor the city of Lyford for the part it is
15 playing in building the Lone Star State and extend to its citizens
16 sincere best wishes for success in all their endeavors.
