WHEREAS, Once part of the San Juan de Carricitos land grant, Lyford was platted in 1907; its early buildings included Pioneer Hall, which served as a school, place of worship, and facility for general gatherings, a post office, and the Lyford Hotel; by the turn of the 21st century, the town's population had reached approximately 2,000; and
