

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, The long and distinguished history of Kingsville has  
2 its source with the King family and the business they founded  
3 exactly 150 years ago, the King Ranch; and

4           WHEREAS, Built three miles east of the King Ranch  
5 headquarters on land carved out of the ranch by Henrietta King,  
6 Kingsville originated as a town on the St. Louis, Brownsville and  
7 Mexico Railway, a project that linked the ranch lands to the city of  
8 Brownsville; in 1904, only a short time after the creation of  
9 Kingsville, the town's citizens cheered the passage of the first  
10 regular passenger train on the new rail line, and the community soon  
11 became an important trade center for farm, ranch, and railroad  
12 families; and

13           WHEREAS, In later years, Kingsville would also enjoy economic  
14 prosperity brought by oil and natural gas production, by Texas A&M  
15 University--Kingsville, and by important military installations;  
16 and

17           WHEREAS, The trailblazing spirit of the early Texans lives on  
18 in modern-day Kingsville, where local officials are supporting such  
19 emerging high-tech industries as the South Texas Spaceport; the  
20 city has also attracted companies such as Lowe's and Calling  
21 Solutions to the area, creating nearly 500 jobs, and recently the  
22 National Weather Service recognized Kingsville's preparedness by  
23 designating it a storm-ready city; this year, as the Lone Star State  
24 celebrates the sesquicentennial of the King Ranch, it is indeed

1 fitting to pay tribute to the municipality without which Kleberg  
2 County would not have prospered so greatly; now, therefore, be it

6 town's long and distinguished history and extend to Mayor Filemon
