Suspending limitations on conference committee jurisdiction, H.B. No. 2359 (Ritter)

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of 1 Texas, 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, That House Rule 13, 2 Section 9(a), be suspended in part as provided by House Rule 13, 3 Section 9(f), to enable the conference committee appointed to 4 5 resolve the differences on House Bill 2359, relating to the programs and systems administered by the Employees Retirement 6 7 System of Texas, to consider and take action on the following 8 matter:

- 9 House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(4), is suspended to permit the 10 committee to add the following new sections to the bill to read as 11 follows:
- SECTION ____. Section 812.003, Government Code, is amended by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsections (e) through (h) to read as follows:
- 15 (d) For persons whose employment or office holding begins on

 16 or after September 1, 2005, membership [Membership] in the employee

 17 class begins on the first day the [a] person is employed or holds

 18 office.
- 19 (e) For persons whose employment or office holding begins
 20 before September 1, 2005, membership in the employee class begins
 21 on the 91st day after the first day a person is employed or holds
 22 office.
- 23 <u>(f) A person who is reemployed or who again holds office</u>
 24 <u>after withdrawing contributions under Subchapter B for previous</u>
 25 <u>service credited in the employee class begins membership in the</u>

- 1 employee class on the 91st day after the first day the person is
- 2 reemployed or again holds office.
- 3 (g) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a member may
- 4 establish service credit only as provided by Section 813.514 for
- 5 service performed during the 90-day waiting period provided by
- 6 Subsection (e) or (f).
- 7 (h) Subsections (e), (f), and (g) and this subsection expire
- 8 September 1, 2005.
- 9 SECTION ____. Subchapter F, Chapter 813, Government Code, is
- amended by adding Section 813.514 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 813.514. CREDIT PURCHASE OPTION FOR CERTAIN SERVICE.
- 12 (a) A member may establish service credit under this section in the
- 13 employee class only for service performed during a 90-day waiting
- 14 period to become a member after beginning employment or holding
- 15 <u>office.</u>
- 16 (b) A member may establish service credit under this section
- 17 by depositing with the retirement system, for each month of service
- 18 credit, the actuarial present value, at the time of deposit, of the
- 19 additional standard retirement annuity benefits that would be
- 20 attributable to the purchase of the service credit under this
- 21 <u>section based on rates and tables recommended by the retirement</u>
- 22 system's actuary and adopted by the board of trustees.
- 23 (c) After a member makes the deposits required by this
- 24 section, the retirement system shall grant the member one month of
- 25 equivalent membership service credit for each month of credit
- 26 approved. A member may establish not more than three months of
- 27 equivalent membership service credit under this section.

- 1 (d) The retirement system shall deposit the amount of the
 2 actuarial present value of the service credit purchased in the
 3 member's individual account in the employees saving account.
- (e) The board of trustees may adopt rules to administer this
 section, including rules that impose restrictions on the
 application of this section as necessary to cost-effectively
 administer this section.

SECTION _____. Section 812.003, Government Code, as amended by this Act, and Section 813.514, Government Code, as added by this Act, apply only to a person who is first employed by or begins to hold an office of the state on or after the effective date of this Act and to a former employee or office holder who has withdrawn retirement contributions under Subchapter B, Chapter 812, Government Code, and is reemployed by or begins to again hold an office of the state on or after the effective date of this Act.

Explanation: The added text is needed to provide that a new state employee or a reemployed state employee who has withdrawn contributions for previous service does not begin to receive service credit until the 91st day of employment. Such employees have the option to purchase service credit for the 90-day period at the actuarial value. This is a temporary change that expires September 1, 2005.
