A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the recognition of a same-sex marriage or a civil union.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 6, Family Code, is amended
5	by adding Section 6.204 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 6.204. RECOGNITION OF SAME-SEX MARRIAGE OR CIVIL
7	UNION. (a) In this section, "civil union" means any relationship
8	status other than marriage that:

- 9 <u>(1) is intended as an alternative to marriage or</u>
 10 <u>applies primarily to cohabitating persons; and</u>
- 11 (2) grants to the parties of the relationship legal
 12 protections, benefits, or responsibilities granted to the spouses
 13 of a marriage.
- 14 <u>(b) A marriage between persons of the same sex or a civil</u>
 15 <u>union is contrary to the public policy of this state and is void in</u>
 16 this state.
- 17 <u>(c) The state or an agency or political subdivision of the</u> 18 state may not give effect to a:
- (1) public act, record, or judicial proceeding that

 creates, recognizes, or validates a marriage between persons of the

 same sex or a civil union in this state or in any other

 jurisdiction; or
- 23 (2) right or claim to any legal protection, benefit, 24 or responsibility asserted as a result of a marriage between

- 1 persons of the same sex or a civil union in this state or in any
- 2 <u>other jurisdiction.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that through the
- 4 designation of guardians, the appointment of agents, and the use of
- 5 private contracts persons may adequately and properly appoint
- 6 guardians and arrange rights relating to hospital visitation,
- 7 property, and the entitlement to proceeds of life insurance
- 8 policies without the existence of any legally recognized familial
- 9 relationship between the persons.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act applies to a same-sex marriage or a
- 11 civil union regardless of whether the marriage or civil union was
- 12 entered into before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
