1	AN ACT
2	relating to restricting written information required of public
3	school classroom teachers.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 11.164, Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 11.164. RESTRICTING WRITTEN INFORMATION [REPORTS].
8	(a) The [On an annual basis, the] board of trustees of each school
9	district shall <u>limit redundant requests for information and</u> [, after
10	soliciting recommendations from each campus-level committee and
11	the district-level committee, consider] the number and length of
12	written reports that <u>a classroom teacher is</u> [employees of the
13	district are] required to prepare. Except as provided by
14	Subsection (b), a classroom teacher may not be required to prepare
15	any written information other than:
16	(1) any report concerning the health, safety, or
17	welfare of a student;
18	(2) a report of a student's grade on a particular
19	assignment or examination;
20	(3) a report of a student's grades at the end of each
21	grade reporting period;
22	(4) a textbook report;
23	(5) a unit or weekly lesson plan that outlines, in a
24	brief and general manner, the information to be presented during

- 1 <u>each period at the secondary level or in each subject or topic at</u>
- 2 the elementary level;
- 3 (6) an attendance report;
- 4 (7) any report required for accreditation review; or
- 5 (8) any information specifically required by law,
- 6 rule, or regulation to be prepared by a classroom teacher.
- 7 <u>(b) The board of trustees shall review paperwork</u>
- 8 requirements imposed on classroom teachers and shall transfer to
- 9 <u>existing noninstructional staff a reporting task that can</u>
- 10 reasonably be accomplished by that staff.
- 11 (c) This section does not preclude a school district from
- 12 collecting essential information, in addition to information
- 13 specified under Subsection (a), from a classroom teacher if
- 14 participation is agreed to by the teacher and the school district.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2003-2004
- 16 school year.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
