A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the creation of rural health centers.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 487, Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 487.059 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 487.059. RURAL HEALTH CENTERS. (a) In this section
7	"rural county" has the definition assigned by Section 487.301.
8	(b) The office, with cooperation from the Texas Department
9	of Health, the Health and Human Services Commission, the statewide
10	rural health care system designated under Chapter 845, Insurance
11	Code, and public health departments in rural counties, shall
12	establish regional health centers in rural counties to coordinate
13	the delivery of health care to residents of rural counties.

- (c) Each agency listed in Subsection (b) shall provide services covered by programs of the agency to residents of rural counties from the regional health centers. Each agency shall contract with health care professionals to work from each regional health center to provide services to residents of the rural counties served by the center. Health care professionals providing services at a rural health center must be eligible to serve residents who are enrolled in federal and agency programs, including:
- 23 (1) the federal supplemental nutrition program for 24 women, infants, and children under 42 U.S.C. Section 1786, as

- 1 <u>amended;</u>
- 2 (2) the state child health plan under Chapter 62,
- 3 Health and Safety Code;
- 4 (3) the medical assistance program under Chapter 32,
- 5 Human Resources Code; and
- 6 (4) the Medicare program.
- 7 (d) The office shall report to the legislature regarding the 8 efficacy of rural health centers as part of the office's report to 9 the legislature under Section 487.056.
- SECTION 2. (a) Not later than January 1, 2004, the Office of
 Rural Community Affairs, after consulting with the Texas Department
 of Health, the Health and Human Services Commission, the statewide
 rural health care system, and public health departments in rural
 counties, shall choose three or four sites to serve as rural health
 centers as required by Section 487.059, Government Code, as added
 by this Act.
- 17 (b) The Office of Rural Community Affairs may designate 18 additional sites as rural health centers if the office determines, 19 as reported in its annual report delivered to the legislature on 20 January 1, 2005, that the rural health centers are effective in 21 coordinating health care services to residents of rural counties.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
