## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study regarding certain child-care initiatives.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. STUDY AND REPORT ON CHILD-CARE INITIATIVES.
- 5 (a) The Health and Human Services Commission shall study and
- 6 produce a comprehensive report on state and local initiatives and
- 7 collaborative initiatives targeted at enhancing the quality of
- 8 child care, including initiatives funded from public or private
- 9 sources.
- 10 (b) The Health and Human Services Commission shall work in
- 11 conjunction with the Texas Workforce Commission and the Department
- 12 of Protective and Regulatory Services in studying the initiatives
- 13 and producing the report.
- 14 (c) The Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 15 coordinate the efforts under this section with the activities of
- 16 the Office of Early Childhood Coordination, particularly as those
- 17 efforts relate to the development of the statewide strategic plan
- 18 required under Section 531.284, Government Code.
- 19 (d) The report must:
- 20 (1) include a description of each initiative's
- 21 activity, including:
- 22 (A) factors relevant to the initiative's
- 23 success; and
- 24 (B) the amount and sources of the initiative's

- 1 funding;
- 2 (2) describe programmatic best practices as models for
- 3 replication statewide; and
- 4 (3) establish statewide benchmarks for quality child
- 5 care.
- 6 (e) The Health and Human Services Commission shall submit
- 7 the report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of
- 8 the house of representatives, and the presiding officers of
- 9 appropriate legislative committees not later than September 1,
- 10 2004.
- 11 SECTION 2. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act expires September 1,
- 2005.
- 13 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 16 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
