## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the provision of subsidized child-care services.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. The heading of Chapter 72, Human Resources Code,
5	is amended to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 72. HEAD START, PREKINDERGARTEN, AND OTHER SIMILAR
7	PROGRAMS
8	SECTION 2. Section 72.003, Human Resources Code, is amended
9	to read as follows:
10	Sec. 72.003. COORDINATION OF SERVICES. (a) In a manner
11	consistent with federal law and regulations, each Head Start and
12	Early Head Start program provider, prekindergarten program
13	provider, and provider of an after-school child-care program
14	provided at a school shall coordinate with the Texas Workforce
15	Commission, Texas Education Agency, and local workforce
16	development boards regarding subsidized child-care services.
17	(b) The coordination required by this section must include $\underline{:}$
18	(1) streamlining the eligibility determination or
19	registration processes for subsidized child-care services and a
20	Head Start or Early Head Start, prekindergarten, or after-school
21	child-care program; and
22	(2) coordinating to ensure, to the extent practicable,
23	that full-day, full-year child-care services are available to meet
24	the needs of low-income parents who are working or participating in

- 2 (c) The coordination required by this section may also
- 3 include:
- 4 (1) cooperating with the Texas Workforce Commission
- 5 regarding studies conducted by the commission;
- 6 (2) collecting data necessary to determine a child's

- 8 Early Head Start, prekindergarten, or after-school child-care
- 9 program, when permissible;
- 10 (3) cooperating to provide for staff training and
- 11 professional development activities;
- 12 (4) identifying and developing methods for the
- 13 collaborative provision of subsidized child-care services and Head
- 14 Start or Early Head Start, prekindergarten, or after-school
- 15 <u>child-care</u> program services, including:
- 16 (A) sharing facilities or staff; and
- 17 (B) increasing the enrollment capacity of those

- 19 (5) identifying child-care facilities located in
- 20 close proximity to Head Start or Early Head Start, prekindergarten,
- 21 or after-school child-care programs; and
- 22 (6) coordinating transportation between child-care

- SECTION 3. (a) Not later than January 1, 2004, the Texas

- 1 programs within the subsidized child-care service industry. In
- 2 developing the plan, the agency shall seek input from:
- 3 (1) parents eligible to receive subsidized child-care
- 4 services;

- 5 (2) parents of children eligible for enrollment in a
- 6 prekindergarten program;
- 7 (3) school districts;
  - (4) the Texas Workforce Commission;
  - (5) local workforce development boards;
- 10 (6) the child-care resource and referral network; and
- 11 (7) the Texas Head Start Collaboration Project.
- 12 (b) The plan must provide that programs to be established
- 13 under the plan be funded using money used for prekindergarten
- 14 programs under Subchapter E, Chapter 29, Education Code, and
- 15 federal child-care development funds to the extent permitted by
- 16 federal law.
- 17 (c) Not later than January 1, 2005, the Texas Education
- 18 Agency shall prepare and deliver the plan to the governor,
- 19 lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and
- 20 clerks of the standing committees of the senate and house of
- 21 representatives with primary jurisdiction over prekindergarten
- 22 programs and state-subsidized child-care services for low-income
- 23 families.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
