A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to carbon monoxide detectors in certain child-care
3	facilities and family homes.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 42.060 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 42.060. CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS. (a) In this
8	section, "carbon monoxide detector" means a device that detects and
9	sounds an alarm to indicate the presence of a harmful level of
10	carbon monoxide gas.
11	(b) Except as provided by Subsection (d), each day-care
12	center, group day-care home, and family home must be equipped with
13	carbon monoxide detectors in accordance with department rules.
14	(c) The department by rule shall prescribe requirements
15	regarding the placement, installation, and number of carbon
16	monoxide detectors and maintenance procedures for those detectors.
17	(d) A day-care center is exempt from the carbon monoxide
18	detector requirements prescribed by this section if the day-care
19	center is located in a school facility that is subject to the school
20	facility standards adopted by the commissioner of education under
21	Section 46.008, Education Code, or similar safety standards adopted
22	by the board of a local school district.
23	SECTION 2. (a) This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
24	(b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a) of this section, a

1 day-care center, group day-care home, or family home is not 2 required to be equipped with carbon monoxide detectors as required 3 by Section 42.060, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act, 4 before January 1, 2004.
