9	REPRESENTATION. (a) This section applies only to:
10	(1) a commissioner;
11	(2) a commission employee whose official
12	responsibilities involve the determination of a workers'
13	compensation claim or the adjudication under Chapter 410 of a
14	dispute involving a workers' compensation claim or who is
15	designated an ombudsman under Chapter 409; and
16	(3) an employee of the State Office of Administrative
17	Hearings involved in hearing workers' compensation cases.
18	(b) A person subject to this section may not:
19	(1) be employed by an insurance company engaged in the
20	business of writing workers' compensation insurance coverage in
21	this state; or
22	(2) represent a person before the commission or State
23	Office of Administrative Hearings or a court in a matter:
24	(A) in which the person was personally involved

- 3 (B) that was within the person's official
- 4 responsibility while the person was associated with the commission
- 5 or State Office of Administrative Hearings.
- 6 (c) The prohibition under Subsection (b)(1) applies until
- 7 <u>the:</u>
- 8 <u>(1) second anniversary of the date a commissioner</u>
- 9 ceases to serve as a commissioner; and
- 10 (2) first anniversary of the date an employee's
- 11 employment with the commission or State Office of Administrative
- 12 Hearings ceases.
- 13 (d) The prohibition under Subsection (b)(2) applies while a
- 14 person is associated with the commission or State Office of
- 15 Administrative Hearings and at any time after.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
