2	relating to the protection of public freshwater areas; providing a
3	penalty.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Title 5, Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended by
6	adding Subtitle I to read as follows:
7	SUBTITLE I. PROTECTED FRESHWATER AREAS
8	CHAPTER 90. ACCESS TO PROTECTED FRESHWATER AREAS
9	Sec. 90.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Emergency" means a condition or circumstance in
11	which a person reasonably believes that an individual has sustained
12	serious bodily injury or is in imminent danger of serious bodily
13	injury or that property has sustained significant damage or
14	destruction or is in imminent danger of significant damage or
15	destruction.
16	(2) "Motor vehicle" means any wheeled or tracked
17	vehicle, machine, tractor, trailer, or semitrailer propelled or
18	drawn by mechanical power and used to transport persons or things.
19	(3) "Protected freshwater area" means that portion of
20	the bottom, bed, or bank of any navigable river or stream. The term
21	does not include that portion of a bed, bottom, or bank that lies
22	below tidewater limits or is privately owned.
23	Sec. 90.002. OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLE IN PROTECTED
24	FRESHWATER AREA PROHIBITED. No person may operate a motor vehicle

1 in or on a protected freshwater area. Sec. 90.003. EXEMPTIONS. (a) Section 90.002 does not 2 3 apply to: 4 (1) a state, county, or municipal road right-of-way; (2) a private road crossing established before January 5 6 1, 2003; or 7 (3) operation of a motor vehicle by: (A) a federal, state, or local government 8 employee if operation of a motor vehicle is necessary for 9 10 conducting official business; (B) an owner of the adjacent uplands and the 11 owner's agents, employees, representatives, and lessees for 12 13 reasonable purposes related to usual and customary agricultural 14 purposes; 15 (C) a person if operation of a motor vehicle is 16 necessary to and is authorized by a mineral lease or crossing easement granted by the General Land Office under the Natural 17 18 Resources Code; (D) a person if operation of a motor vehicle is 19 20 necessary to an activity authorized by Chapter 86; or 21 (E) a person in response to an emergency. 22 (b) A person exempt under this section who operates a motor vehicle in or on a protected freshwater area shall do so in a manner 23

that avoids, to the extent reasonably possible, harming or

disturbing vegetation, wildlife, or wildlife habitat within the

protected freshwater area. A person exempt under this section who

is crossing a protected freshwater area shall cross by the most

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- direct feasible route.
- 2 Sec. 90.004. LANDOWNER RIGHTS. (a) A prescriptive
- 3 easement over private property cannot be created by recreational
- 4 use of a protected freshwater area, including by portage over or
- 5 around barriers, scouting of obstructions, or crossing of private
- 6 property to or from a protected freshwater area.
- 7 (b) Nothing in this section shall limit the right of a
- 8 person to navigate in, on, or around a protected freshwater area.
- 9 Sec. 90.005. PUBLIC ACCESS. (a) Except as otherwise
- 10 allowed by law, no person may restrict, obstruct, interfere with,
- or limit public recreational use of a protected freshwater area.
- 12 (b) This section does not allow the public to use private
- 13 property to gain access to a protected freshwater area without
- 14 permission of the landowner.
- Sec. 90.006. ENFORCEMENT. All peace officers of this state
- shall enforce the provisions of this Act.
- Sec. 90.007. PENALTY. (a) A person commits an offense if
- the person violates Section 90.002 or 90.005.
- 19 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), an offense under
- 20 Subsection (a) is a Class C misdemeanor.
- 21 (c) If it is shown on the trial of an offense under this
- 22 section that the defendant was previously convicted two or more
- 23 times under Section 90.002 or 90.005, or Sections 90.002 and
- 24 90.005, on conviction the defendant shall be punished for a Class B
- 25 misdemeanor.
- 26 (d) Each day of a violation under this section is a separate
- offense.

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1 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
