- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Chapter 49, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Section 49.002 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 49.002. EDUCATION FOR HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS AND
- 7 ATTORNEYS. (a) The department shall develop a program to educate
- 8 health care providers and attorneys in this state regarding
- 9 anatomical gifts.

- 11 donation information to clients seeking legal advice for
- 12 end-of-life decisions.
- 13 (c) The department shall encourage medical schools and
- 14 nursing schools in this state to include mandatory organ donation

- 16 (d) The department shall encourage medical schools and
- 17 hospitals in this state to require a physician in a neurology or
- 18 neurosurgery residency program to complete an advanced course in

- 20 SECTION 2. Section 692.0145, Health and Safety Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- (c) The Texas Department of Health shall adopt rules to
