4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Move Over Act.
6	SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
7	is amended by adding Section 545.157 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 545.157. PASSING AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLE.
9	(a) On approaching a stationary authorized emergency vehicle
10	using visual signals that meet the requirements of Sections 547.305
11	and 547.702, an operator, unless otherwise directed by a police
12	officer, shall:
13	(1) vacate the lane closest to the emergency vehicle
14	when driving on a highway with two or more lanes traveling in the
15	direction of the emergency vehicle; or
16	(2) slow to a speed not to exceed:
17	(A) 20 miles per hour less than the posted speed
18	limit when the posted speed limit is 25 miles per hour or more; or
19	(B) five miles per hour when the posted speed
20	limit is less than 25 miles per hour.
21	(b) A violation of this section is:
22	(1) a misdemeanor punishable under Section 542.401;
23	(2) a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of \$500 if the
24	violation results in property damage; or

1	(3) a Class B misdemeanor if the violation results in
2	bodily injury.
3	(c) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
4	also constitutes an offense under another section of this code or
5	the Penal Code, the actor may be prosecuted under either section or
6	under both sections.
7	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
