4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Sections 154.006(b) and (e), Occupations Code,
6	are amended to read as follows:
7	(b) A profile must contain the following information on each
8	physician:
9	(1) the name of each medical school attended and the
10	dates of:
11	(A) graduation; or
12	(B) Fifth Pathway designation and completion of
13	the Fifth Pathway Program;
14	(2) a description of all graduate medical education ir
15	the United States or Canada;

- 16 (3) any specialty certification held by the physician
- 17 and issued by a medical licensing board that is a member of the
- 18 American Board of Medical Specialties or the Bureau of Osteopathic
- 19 Specialists;
- 20 (4) the number of years the physician has actively
- 21 practiced medicine in:
- 22 (A) the United States or Canada; and
- 23 (B) this state;
- 24 (5) the name of each hospital in this state in which

- 1 the physician has privileges;
- 2 (6) the physician's primary practice location;
- 3 (7) the type of language translating services,
- 4 including translating services for a person with impairment of
- 5 hearing, that the physician provides at the physician's primary
- 6 practice location;
- 7 (8) whether the physician participates in the Medicaid
- 8 program;
- 9 (9) [a description of any conviction for a felony, a
- 10 Class A or Class B misdemeanor, or a Class C misdemeanor involving
- 11 moral turpitude during the 10-year period preceding the date of the
- 12 profile;
- 13 [(10) a description of any charges reported to the
- 14 board during the 10-year period preceding the date of the profile to
- 15 which the physician has pleaded no contest, for which the physician
- 16 is the subject of deferred adjudication or pretrial diversion, or
- 17 in which sufficient facts of quilt were found and the matter was
- 18 continued by a court;
- 19 [(11)] a description of any final disciplinary action
- 20 against the physician by the board during the 10-year period
- 21 preceding the date of the profile, including any final disciplinary
- 22 action taken by the board on medical malpractice claims or
- 23 complaints required to be reviewed by the board under Section
- 24 164.201;
- (10) $\left[\frac{(12)}{(12)}\right]$ a description of any final public
- 26 disciplinary action against the physician by a medical licensing
- 27 board of another state during the 10-year period preceding the date

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- 1 of the profile; and
- 2 (11) [(13) a description of the final resolution taken
- 3 by the board on medical malpractice claims or complaints required
- 4 to be opened by the board under Section 164.201;
- 5 $\left[\frac{(14)}{}\right]$ whether the physician's patient service areas
- 6 are accessible to disabled persons, as defined by federal law[; and
- 7 [(15) a description of any formal complaint against
- 8 the physician initiated and filed under Section 164.005 and the
- 9 status of the complaint].
- 10 (e) A pending malpractice claim or complaint, other than a
- 11 claim disclosed under Subsection (b)(9) [(b)(13)], may not be
- 12 disclosed to the public by the board. This subsection does not
- 13 prevent the board from investigating and disciplining a physician
- on the basis of a pending medical malpractice claim or complaint.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
