5	SECTION 1. Section 801.361, Occupations Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 801.361. DISPOSAL OF ANIMAL REMAINS. (a) <u>In this</u>
8	section, "medical waste" includes animal waste, blood, gloves,
9	sleeves, newspapers, and plastic bags, but does not include sharps.
10	(b) A veterinarian may dispose of the remains of an animal
11	and medical waste associated with the animal by burial or burning
12	if:
13	(1) the burial or burning occurs on property owned by
14	the veterinarian that is located:
15	(A) outside the corporate boundaries of a
16	municipality; or
17	(B) within the corporate boundaries of a
18	municipality as a result of an annexation that occurs on or after
19	September 1, 2003; and
20	(2) at least one of the following requirements is met:
21	(A) a veterinarian-client-patient relationship
22	existed between the veterinarian, the owner or other caretaker of
23	the animal, and the animal before the animal's death;
24	(B) the veterinarian diagnosed, treated,

boarded, or otherwise cared for the animal before its death; or 1 2 (C) the veterinarian performed euthanasia or an autopsy on the animal [does not charge for the burning or burial]. 3 (c) [(b)] Notwithstanding any other law, the Texas [Natural 4 5 Resource Conservation | Commission on Environmental Quality may not adopt a rule that prohibits conduct authorized by this section. 6 7 (d) [(c)] This section prevails over any other law that authorizes a governmental entity to: 8 (1) prohibit or restrict outdoor burning; or 9 (2) abate a public nuisance [applies only in a county 10 with a population of less than 10,000]. 11

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
