3 (b) To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails over 4 another Act of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, 5 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 6 codes.

SECTION 31. (a) This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.

8 (b) A rule adopted by the Texas Board of Professional Land 9 Surveying applicable to Chapter 1071, Occupations Code, that is in 10 effect on the effective date of this Act shall remain in effect as a 11 rule of the Texas Board of Professional Land Surveying until 12 superseded by a new rule adopted by the Texas Board of Professional 13 Land Surveying.

14 (c) The changes in law made by this Act by Section 1071.053, 15 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, and Section 1071.059, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, in the prohibitions on or 16 17 qualifications of members of the Texas Board of Professional Land Surveying do not affect the entitlement of a member serving on the 18 Texas Board of Professional Land Surveying immediately before 19 September 1, 2003, to continue to serve and function as a member of 20 21 the Texas Board of Professional Land Surveying for the remainder of the member's term. Those changes in law apply only to a member 22 23 appointed on or after September 1, 2003.

(d) The change in law made by this Act to Chapter 1071,
Occupations Code, relating to the investigation of a complaint
applies only to a complaint filed with the Texas Board of
Professional Land Surveying on or after the effective date of this

1 Act. A complaint filed with the board before the effective date of 2 this Act is governed by the law as it existed immediately before 3 that date, and the former law is continued in effect for that 4 purpose.
