- 9 SECTION 17. (a) The changes in law made by this Act in the
- 10 prohibitions or qualifications applying to members of the Texas
- 11 Council on Purchasing from People with Disabilities do not affect
- 12 the entitlement of a member serving on the council immediately
- 13 before September 1, 2003, to continue to serve and function as a
- 14 member of the council for the remainder of the member's term. Those
- 15 changes in law apply only to a member appointed on or after
- 16 September 1, 2003.
- 17 (b) As the terms of members of the Texas Council on
- 18 Purchasing from People with Disabilities expire or as vacancies on
- 19 the council occur, the governor shall make appointments to the
- 20 council to achieve as soon as possible the membership plan
