- 15 Constitution and under the other law, the composition and terms of
- 16 the governing body do not comply with the Texas Constitution.
- 17 SECTION 49.04. Except as otherwise provided by this Act,
- 18 this Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of
- 19 two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by
- 20 Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not
- 21 receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes
- 22 effect September 1, 2003.
